# Yes Please (put these items in your blue recycling bin)

**Plastic** Moulded plastic packaging (e.g. toys, chocolates, biscuits);

all food pots, tubs and travs

Foil trays, foil cases, blister packs, takeaway containers, tin foil

**Metal** Biscuit and sweet tins, cans, bottle and jar lids, empty aerosols

including squirty cream

Glass Champagne/wine bottles, perfume/aftershave bottles, beer bottles and jars

Paper and Card Folded boxes, cardboard crisp tubes, juice/fruit cartons, paper hats,

Christmas cards (no bows or adornments), wrapping paper (non shiny and scrunchable), gift tags, Christmas crackers (remove contents and snap)

#### No Thank you (put these items in your black bin)

**Plastic** Bubble wrap, polystyrene packaging, plastic bags, film lids, cling film,

sweet wrappers, food pouches

**Foil** Crisp packets, scrunched up / dirty foil **Glass** Broken drinking glasses and crockery

**Paper and Card** Shredded paper, paper/kitchen towels, serviettes, wet paper / card
