Statement of Policy

It is the view of the Parish Council that by planning for future activities in the Parish, a proactive attitude is projected rather than that of a reactive response.

The Council believes that Parishes form an important tier of Local Government at a "grass roots" level close to the people.

The Council will seek to play a key role in leading and empowering the local community.

The Council firmly believes in maintaining the fabric of the village and protecting the village environment.

Statement of Objectives

- The Council will always practice open accountability, effective communication with residents, prompt response to residents' enquiries and suggestions and will hold open meetings. Fifteen Minutes will be allowed at each Full Council meeting for residents to express their views on items on the agenda, unless the Chairman agrees to take other matters.
- Use of the "Two Villages" magazine and the Council's website will be key instruments in meeting the objectives above.
- In order to support the Clerk, the Council will provide any required reference books.
- All Councillors will undertake training to ensure they are able to fulfil their role and keep abreast of relevant current legislation.

Mini roundabout cannot go ahead unless Vicarage Field development goes ahead. 20mph zone was rejected in January 2024, but with a note that it may be possible with engineering works. This is to be investigated by WSCC with a view to reapplying in the future. The Clerk will communicate with the Highways Manager to ensure this investigation takes place as soon as possible. The raised pillow on Lion Lane needs to be applied for via a Community Highways Scheme. This will be progressed via the Roads and Transport Working Group and the Clerk. To continue to work with Paddockhurst Estate on plans for Vicarage Field and Old Estate Yard development as per the Neighbourhood Plan.	To ensure that the detailed requirements for this development are adhered to and building work can begin as soon as possible. Final designs are still awaited although there is little scope for amending the initial plans as the provision of roads cannot be amended.	the Clerk and a final decision made by the Council. To improve facilities at The Ark using S106 funding (and any other grant funding available) including: New flooring in the Dunlop Hall Replacing the front doors To increase the repairs and renewals fund for boiler/pipe improvements and other repairs. The majority of this work is now complete with 34 lanterns having been upgraded to LEDs, with 13 remaining. The Council has budgeted to complete this work in 2024.
